Resorts World Sentosa's Singapore Oceanarium introduces new experiences as ticket sales go live

New programmes and opening celebrations are announced ahead of the oceanarium's public opening on 24 July.

SINGAPORE, 25 June 2025 – Resorts World Sentosa (RWS, 圣淘沙名胜世界) has announced that ticket sales have launched for **Singapore Oceanarium** (新加坡海洋生态馆), which will officially welcome public guests from 24 July 2025 after an official closed-door opening ceremony on 23 July 2025. This marks the public's first opportunity to experience a transformative, world-class marine experience where storytelling, marine science and meaningful engagement come together to spark knowledge, love and action for our oceans.

To celebrate the launch, Singapore Oceanarium will present a season of opening celebrations featuring a curated series of showcases and a variety of activities by distinguished local talents — encompassing hands-on workshops, installations, presentations and more, designed for visitors of all ages to discover their role in ocean stewardship. Beyond these special celebrations, the oceanarium has also unveiled an expanded suite of purpose-driven public programmes that can be added on to the oceanarium's day experience.

Opening celebrations: A season of stories and discovery

A highlight of the opening is **Research & Learning Week**, taking place from 25 to 27 July 2025 within the Singapore Oceanarium's dedicated **Research and Learning Centre (研究与学习中心)**. Curated for individuals interested in ocean stewardship, the programme features a range of expert-led talks, hands-on workshops, and curated installations — delivered by both institutional partners and in-house specialists — that showcase ongoing research and advance ocean literacy.

Among the featured showcases is the **Living Oceans Exhibition**, an insightful look at the diversity and beauty of our blue planet. Presented in collaboration with the National University of Singapore (NUS) and Sentosa Development Corporation (SDC), this showcase features curated specimens from the Lee Kong Chian Natural History Museum and research posters from the RWS-NUS Living Laboratory partnership. Together, they underscore the rich biodiversity of marine ecosystems and highlight the importance of protecting our shared ocean heritage.

Ties That Bind, a compelling photo gallery by internationally acclaimed Singaporean photographers Toh Xing Jie and Michael Aw, takes centre stage at the oceanarium. Situated within the **Spirit of Exploration** zone, the installation highlights the intricate relationships that sustain ocean life, offering an emotive visual narrative of interdependence, resilience and hope.

As part of SG60 National Day celebrations, *Ties That Bind* highlights the works of Singaporean photographers, showcasing their passion for the ocean and efforts to inspire greater awareness and action for marine conservation. The showcase also has a dedicated section that features marine animals native to Singapore waters, emphasising the rich biodiversity of our local marine environment.

Purpose-driven programmes: Experiences that inspire wonder and action

Adding to the excitement, Singapore Oceanarium introduces a comprehensive suite of signature programmes designed to deepen engagement with marine science and conservation.

The **Singapore Oceanarium Insider Experience** offers an exclusive behind-the-scenes journey into the heart of the oceanarium's operations. Designed to deepen appreciation for marine care and conservation, this expert-guided experience reveals how the oceanarium maintains its immersive habitats and supports the wellbeing of its marine animals, offering meaningful insights into the wonders of marine life.

The **Fossilist Workshop**, conducted at the Research and Learning Centre, offers participants an eye-opening exploration of fossil formation and scientific significance. Designed for adults and families, the programme includes hands-on excavation activities where participants can unearth and retain their prehistoric discoveries.

The educational journey continues with a curated series of marine animal-themed spotlight programmes.

- **Animal Spotlight: Sea Jellies**
Here, guests encounter ancient drifters whose pulsating grace has remained unchanged for over 500 million years. The experience includes a guided behind-the-scenes tour of the Aquarist Lab, where guests observe sea jelly husbandry and breeding efforts, witness a live feeding session and see aquarists in action.
- **Animal Spotlight: Corals**
This exclusive behind-the-scenes tour turns attention to the living architects of the reef, revealing their critical role in sustaining marine biodiversity and the efforts underway to

protect them. Visitors can also observe our aquarists in action and learn about their coral propagation efforts firsthand.

- **Ocean in Focus: Into the Abyss**

This is an in-depth guided tour that offers a closer look into how deep-dwelling animals have not just adapted and survived but thrived in the harshest of conditions. This tour offers private access to support areas where specialised care is provided for these elusive, yet intriguing animals.

Empowering engagement through technology and storytelling

Launching on 23 July 2025, the **Singapore Oceanarium mobile app** unlocks an entirely new level of interactivity for guests. With augmented and virtual reality features, users can dive deeper into the marine experience, purchase tickets, participate in volunteer activities and access exclusive content to enrich their visit. Guests with valid admission tickets can enjoy priority lane access to enter the oceanarium and unlock free access to **Pier Adventure** (worth S\$10, valid till 31 August 2025), simply by downloading the app and creating an account. Pier Adventure is a suspended web that offers a fresh, elevated view of the Jewel of Muscat, a replica of a ninth-century Arabian dhow from the former Maritime Experiential Museum & Aquarium, and its surrounding areas.

The journey further invites guests to become co-stewards of the ocean through interactive pledges and story-driven zones that show how small actions can make a big impact. Guests can submit personal commitments via their device and see them displayed in real time on a dynamic digital pledge board — a living visual of collective action, inspired by the fluid motion of ocean waves. Each pledge is also emailed as a personalised digital card, creating a lasting reminder of one's commitment.

At the heart of this zone lies one of the world’s largest Kreisel habitats, home to thousands of Moon Jellies that pulse and free-float in mesmerising, ever changing movements. Beyond this, cylindrical habitats offer a 360-degree view of other captivating species, including Atlantic Sea Nettles, Fried Egg Sea Jellies and more. Enhanced by immersive lighting and ethereal soundscapes, every ripple and pulse comes to life in a truly awe-inspiring experience.</p> <p>Our dedicated aquarists meticulously breed and nurture many of these sea jellies in-house, ensuring their health and well-being. With rotating live displays, no two visits will ever be the same. Come witness evolution in motion.</p>

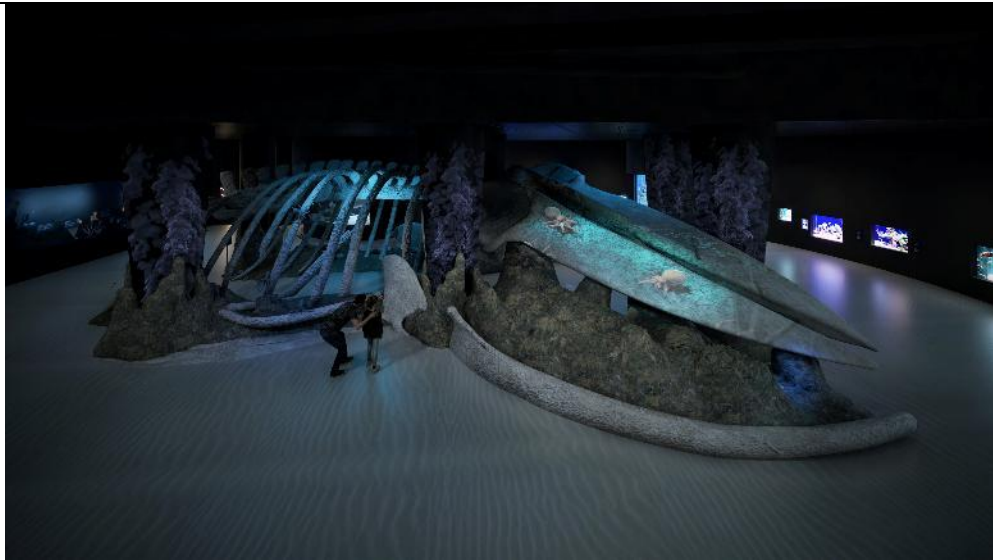

**Whale Fall
and
Seamount**



In the depths of the ocean, where food is scarce, a fallen giant becomes an unexpected oasis. A whale fall – the final resting place of a whale – creates a rich ecosystem, sustaining deep-sea life for decades.


This zone brings this phenomenon to life with a whale fall skeleton and an immersive projection show, illustrating the remarkable decomposition process and the species that depend on it. Surrounding the scene, hydrothermal vents simulate towering sea mounts, showcasing the hidden geological features that shape deep-sea ecosystems. Live deep-sea habitats introduce visitors to unique animals like the Japanese Isopod, Deepsea Akaza Prawn, and Australian Ghostshark, thriving in this extreme environment.

With an atmospheric blend of lighting and soundscapes, witness the circle of life in the ocean's deepest realms – revealing how even in the darkest places, life finds a way to flourish.

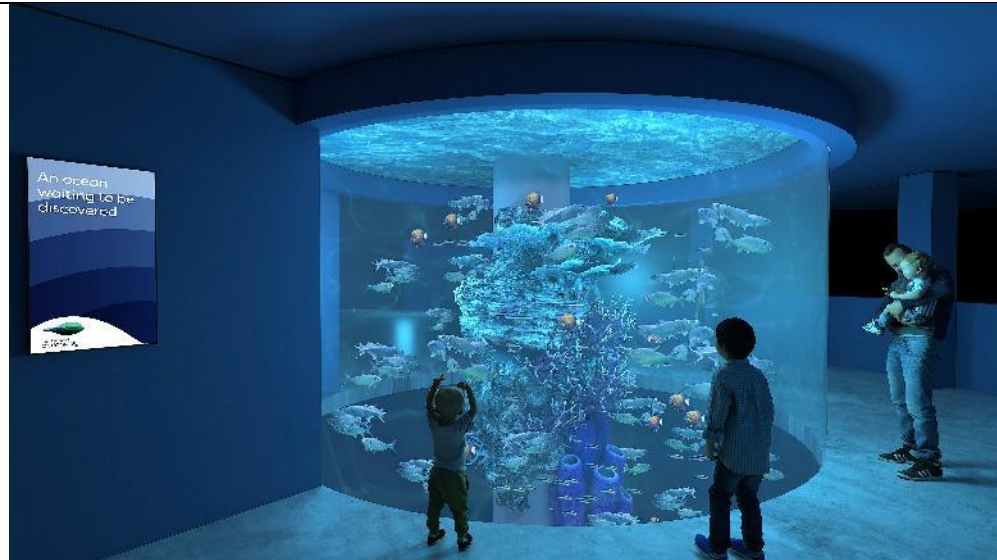
**Drop of
Water**



Life as we know it began in a single drop of water—with plankton small, yet powerful enough to shape entire ecosystems. Drop of Water brings this hidden world into breathtaking focus, transforming the microscopic into the magnificent.

	<p>Gaze up at the awe-inspiring domed ceiling, designed to mimic a suspended drop of water, where a mesmerising projection unveils the life teeming within. Watch plankton – tiny but essential to marine life – move in an ever-shifting dance, magnified to a scale never seen before. The digital display brings these unseen organisms to life, swirling and pulsing as they would in their natural habitat across our oceans.</p> <p>This is the ocean at its most fundamental level – a world invisible to the naked eye, now larger than life and waiting to be explored.</p>
<p>Spirit of Exploration</p>	 <p>Curiosity has always pushed the boundaries of the known world, leading to discoveries that shaped the world as we know it today.</p> <p>At the heart of the Spirit of Exploration zone lies the Jewel of Muscat, a remarkable reconstruction of a 9th-century Omani dhow, a vessel that once navigated the vast Indian Ocean. Above it, the Pier Adventure’s suspended web offers a daring new perspective, inviting visitors to step beyond solid ground and unlock a whole new perspective of the zone. Nearby, the Explorer’s Nook café provides a moment of respite, with marine themed pastries and curated lifestyle products.</p> <p>Step into the footsteps of explorers past and present, and leave with a renewed sense of wonder, because every great journey begins with the spirit of exploration.</p>

Migrators



As twilight descends over the open ocean, life stirs in the depths. In a cycle as old as the sea itself, marine creatures rise from the darkness below while others embark on journeys stretching across entire oceans. Vertical Migrators and Horizontal Migrators bring these extraordinary movements to life, offering a rare window into the travellers of the deep.


The Vertical Migrators habitat reveals species that move with the changing light, like the Japanese Pineapplefish whose bioluminescent glow likely helps it communicate with others of its kind or camouflage. Alongside them, the Horizontal Migrators habitat highlights ocean wanderers like the Indo-Pacific Bottlenose Dolphins, navigating vast distances with precision honed by generations.

Every migration is a story of survival, resilience, and instinct. In this space, these stories unfold, revealing the silent travellers that shape the ocean's endless rhythm.

This zone extends beyond the water with Tidal Trove offering merchandise designed to inspire discovery and learning, as well as Tide Deli which provides a quick refuel with light bites, energising those eager to continue their journey through the deep.

Benthos



	<p>Traveling deeper, the sun fades, revealing the natural wonders found near the bottom of the shallow seas. At Benthos, experience this diverse community of marine life that thrives in this environment through a series of live habitats where elusive Green Morays weave through rocky crevices and formidable Tasmanian Giant Crabs navigate terrain. A cylindrical habitat brings the reef to life, teeming with species like the Banggai Cardinalfish and Yellow Tang, each playing a role in this underwater community.</p> <p>At the Art-quarium – an interactive touch table, visitors can mix different traits to create their own digital fish, while learning how these adaptations help marine species survive in their environment.</p> <p>Whether it is experiencing vibrant marine life up close, or creating unique species digitally, there’s something for everyone here.</p>
<p>Life in the Deep</p>	 <p>In the vast depths of the oceans, life has evolved in extraordinary ways. Deprived of sunlight and subjected to immense pressure, creatures here have adapted with bioluminescence, unique body structures, and surprising survival strategies.</p> <p>This zone offers a rare glimpse into this mysterious world through a display of preserved specimens of deep-sea species, each telling a story of adaptation and resilience. Lighting effects create an immersive deep-sea atmosphere, with floor projections of bioluminescent plankton flickering like underwater stars. Download the Singapore Oceanarium app to enjoy an Augmented Reality (AR) experience and learn more about these specimens.</p> <p>From stunning visuals to cutting-edge technology, Life in the Deep brings the unseen world of the deep into focus, offering an experience that is both enlightening and awe-inspiring.</p>
<p>Conquering Land</p>	<p>The journey from water to land was one of nature’s greatest leaps. Conquering Land is an experience that reveals this defining moment in evolution—the bold step from water to land.</p> <p>Enter a world where the past and present collide. Live habitats showcase Axolotls, Japanese Giant Salamanders and Poison Dart Frog. Alongside them, extinct species such as the Eryops and Diplocaulus reappear through digital representations using the Pepper’s Ghost effect, seamlessly blending in the past with the present in a stunning display.</p> <p>This immersive space offers visitors a rare glimpse into the species that paved the way for life on land—revealing a story millions of years in the making.</p>

<p>Shark Seas</p>	<p>Beneath the ocean’s shimmering surface, where the sunlight fades into endless blue, lives a world of silent hunters – majestic, powerful, and vital to marine life. This experience offers a rare, uninterrupted glimpse into the ocean’s wonders, creating the breathtaking illusion of being submerged within the open sea.</p> <p>For those who wish to pause and take it all in, Ocean Bites serves up savoury bites and sweet delights amidst awe-inspiring views.</p>

These human-made structures – whether shipwrecks, sculptures, or purpose-built reef formations – offer shelter, breeding grounds, and food sources for a diverse array of species. Over time, they become thriving ecosystems, supporting marine biodiversity in ways that mimic natural reef formations.</p> <p>Here, the Shipwreck habitat encompasses a walkthrough tunnel and a viewing panel where the likes of Zebra Sharks and Blotched Fantail Rays glide through the remnants of a sunken vessel. Beyond the shipwreck, explore replicas of artificial habitats developed with insights from researchers and conservationists. These structures demonstrate how science and innovation come together to create sustainable environments for marine species. Witness how even the smallest crevices in these formations provide refuge for a wide range of marine animals like the Bonnethead Shark among others.</p> <p>The journey continues with a glimpse into history at the Bakau Wreck, where artifacts from the past highlight how shipwrecks not only tell human stories but also become lifelines for marine ecosystems and make the zone come alive.</p> <p>Whether uncovering the past or shaping the future of marine conservation, this is a space to discover, learn, and be inspired by the resilience of ocean life.</p>
